

# AFSCME Council 65 Executive Director, & AFSCME International Vice-President

When we look back on this year, I hope we can remember all we accomplished instead of how difficult things have been. For many of us, after almost two years on the frontlines of this pandemic, this year was filled with stress, chaos, and fatigue. Yet, together, the members of AFSCME Council 65 have accomplished amazing things. 2021 saw a rebirth of solidarity and collective action. You and your union siblings showed AFSCME can lead in Minnesota and South Dakota.

AFSCME Dispatchers in Itasca County, pushed for a working group to set training standards to improve Minnesota's emergency response system. Denied a pay increase in 2021, and lacking a voice in their workplace, workers at Lake Region Hospital's Cancer Care and Research Center organized and formed a union. Now after ratifying their first AFSCME contract, workers are seeing wage increases up to 12%. Our Brown County local in South Dakota fought back their employers attempt to decertify their union, winning their election 26 to 1. All together AFSCME 65 had 14 new locals organize with us.

As the pandemic drags on, workers across the country are realizing the value of their work and demanding fair treatment and respect. From a record number of new unions and members nationwide, to #Striketober, #Strikesgiving and #MerryStrikemas. At Council 65 we saw the same momentum for our movement. We helped 14

groups of workers organize their first union, and over 1,600 of your coworkers chose to sign a membership card joining your union. We were able to accrete 33 positions into our existing locals.

In South Dakota, Executive Board Member-Tanner Corbin lead a member drive signing up 108 new members. We welcomed the Lincoln County Highway workers. In Brown County, the employer saw the union membership had fallen and tried to dissolve the local. The local organized itself from one member to winning a recertification vote 26 to 1! That is the power of organizing, and the power of you the AFSME Member.

### **New Tools to Organize Your Local**

Digital Membership Cards: You can now go paperless! Thanks to our new online membership card you can sign coworkers up using your phone, tablet, or computer. Simply go to www.afscme65.org/join or use our Local Leader Business Cards below to sign them up. Once they complete the card, our office automatically receives a copy and processes their membership.





**Communication Tools:** We have a number of new tools that can help medium or large locals stay organized with effective communication. Talk to your Labor Representative if you are interest in trying any of these tools.

**Email**—We can help you send meeting invitations or contract information to your members personal email addresses.

**Text**—For important meetings or actions, we can send text messages to members reminding them of an important event or issue.

**Social Media**—Many locals already have a Facebook Page or Group, if yours doesn't you should talk with your leaders and consider creating one. We should meet members where they are, and 70% of adults are on Facebook. We can help!

**Local Leader Business Cards:** Do new members of your local struggle to know who to contact with questions about their union or contract? Start giving out our Local Leader Business Cards. They include a QR code and link to the digital membership cards above, making it easy for them to join. There are blank spaces for each leader to leave their contact information, and information on how to contact our offices. The back reminds members about their Weingarten right to have a steward join them for any disciplinary meeting.

### **Resolutions & Constitutional Amendments:**

#### Resolution 1: Raising Up Frontline Heroes

AFSCME Council 65 resolves to support frontline workers, to make them whole, protect them in future emergencies, and make sure our communities never forget their struggles and sacrifices.

#### **Resolution 2: Hourly School Worker Equity**

AFSCME Council 65 resolves to fight to make hourly school workers eligible for the same benefits and programs available to other workers.

### **Resolution 3: Mental Health Systems**

AFSCME 65 resolves to support the mental health of all members and organize and support behavioral and mental health workers.

### **Resolution 4: Workplace Safety**

AFSCME 65 resolves fight for the safety of all workers on the job.

#### Amendment 1: Membership & Revenue

This amendment removed outdated language relating to certain larger locals of over 250 members. The updated provision can be seen in Article IV, Section 2 of our AFSCME Council 65 Constitution.

### **AFSCME International Leadership**



President Lee Saunders, was elected at the 40th International Convention in 2012. A member from Cleveland, Saunders was a labor economist before becoming a leader for AFSCME. Saunders is the first African American to Serve as President.



Secretary-Treasurer Elissa McBride, joined the labor movement as an organizer with the AFL-CIO. She joined AFSCME in 2001 as the Director of Education and Leadership Training, helping build the next generation of AFSCME local leaders. She has worked tirelessly to help train and support all of our local treasurers.

# AFSCME is Working for You American Rescue Plan

#### What's in it?

- \$360 billion in Relief Funding for State & Local Governments
- \$170 billion in aid to local schools to help them reopen safely.
- Up to \$1,400 in relief to working families.
- \$100 billion in aid to public transit systems.
- \$200 million for enforcement of workplace safety.
- Emergency COBRA Subsidies for workers laid off.
- Local Healthcare Grants & Emergency Funding
- Major increases to the Child Tax Credit, and Earned Income Tax Credit.

#### What it took:

In order to get this passed, it took a nationwide effort from our AFSCME family. Together we:

- Generated more than 138,000 calls and letters to Congress & the White House.
- Partnered with 800 Governors & Local Officials to stress the needs of frontline workers.
- Shared stories through 33 press events, all with the unmistakable message: Fund the Frontlines.

AFSCME President Lee Saunders hailed the signing of the relief bill as "a historic victory for public service workers and working families across the country," and called it "a bold and comprehensive expression of our values."

# Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act

#### What's in it?

- Grants to help State & Local Governments to repair roadways and bridges.
- Increased funding for operating and maintaining local public transit systems.
- \$11.7 billion for drinking water projects, \$15 billion for lead pipe replacement, and another \$11.7 billion for waste water projects.
- \$42 billion for broadband access.
- And so much more!
